Raising Our Children's Kids Support Group (ROCK)

for Grandparents and other Caregivers

Who: Any grandparents, foster parents, or other family members who are now the primary caregiver for children

When: Thursdays from 5:30 to 7PM, beginning May 12th through June 16th, 2022

Where: Highland Hills Middle School Library

Why? <u>This six-week program</u> is for Grandparents, foster parents and other family members who are raising children. You are super-heroes! And you deserve some time to find ways to improve the quality of your health, your mental and emotional well-being. By interacting, sharing challenges and encouraging one another, grandparents and other caregivers can address:

Session 1: What do you need?

Introduction of program, and getting to know you and your needs.

Session 2: Preventing Burnout, Coping Strategies and Promoting Well-being

Your well-being will help support the well-being of the children you care for.

Session 3: Substance Abuse and the Intergenerational Impact

Learn about the disease of addiction, patterns of behaviors in families with substance use disorders, and participate in guided discussion about risk factors including adverse childhood experiences.

Session 4: Understanding Behaviors and Possible Solutions

Discuss common behavior challenges including trauma induced characteristics and how to reinforce positive behaviors and increase bonding.

Session 5: Contemporary Issues and Resources—Feeling Better Equipped

Review legal rights as a grandparent/caregiver, learn about the resources available to help, and learn latest trends that can impact a child's mental and emotional well-being.

Session 6: Healthy Youth Development- What helps?

Learn about milestones, developmental assets, and the building blocks of healthy behaviors.
